Dr. Darren N.J. Middleton will preach on the topic "Believing Skeptics Amid Life's Emptiness" at 10:45 a.m. Sunday, June 12, in Hall Auditorium. He also will lecture at 10 a.m. Monday-Thursday, June 13-16, in Crouse Chapel.

Dr. Middleton was born and raised in England and educated at the Universities of Manchester, Oxford and Glasgow. He is an ordained Baptist minister, author of three books and associate professor of religion at Texas Christian University. He will be a Visiting Fellow at Cambridge in 2006.

JAZZ GREAT CHICK COREA PERFORMS JUNE 18 IN BAY VIEW

Chick Corea, an award-winning international pioneer of modern jazz, will perform at 8 p.m. Saturday, June 18, in John M. Hall Auditorium.

The concert is presented by The Bay View Association in collaboration with the Crooked Tree Arts Center.

Appearing with his new Touchstone quintet, Corea revisits the Spanish/Flamenco influences

at the heart of his classic Touchstone album, and continues the exploration in a brand new set of compositions.

OPENING FESTIVAL CONCERT HONORS CROOKED TREE

The opening of the Wednesday Festival Series at the Bay View Music Festival is 8 p.m. June 22 in Hall Auditorium. Call 348-9551 for tickets and information.

On this evening The Bay View Music Festival honors the Crooked Tree Arts Center for its tremendous commitment to the arts and invites the community to join Bay View in honoring this extraordinary Arts Center for its many contributions to the region.

The concert will open with three songs for piano and tenor arranged by Herbert Hughes, and will be performed by Richard

Kennedy, tenor. This evening marks the debut of Richard Kennedy in this series.

Veteran bassoonist at Bay View, Jill Marderness, will play one of the most important works in the bassoon literature, the slow movement of the "Concerto for Bassoon" of Mozart. Kelly Hale will join Jill Marderness on this rich work of the Classical period.

Rich Korngod wrote a compelling work for violin and piano entitled "Much Ado About Nothing." Timothy Cheek, piano, and Andrew Bruck, violin, will collaborate on this work from the

Romantic era. Bay View's organist, Kelly Hale, will perform Fritz Kreisler's "The Old Refrain."

The program closes with one of Dvorak's most famous chamber works, the "String Quartet in F Major, The American." This work will be performed by Bay View's string quartet-in-residence, the Westbrook Quartet. Andrew Bruck and Seunghee Lee, violins; Cynthia Kempf, viola; and Carl Donakowski, cello, are members of the quartet.
