Florida Pastor Will Focus on Book of Ruth

The Rev. Dr. Ronald M. Patterson will focus on the book of Ruth during his time as guest pastor/lecturer in Bay View Sunday-Thursday, June 10-14.

Dr. Patterson is the senior minister of the United Church of Christ of Naples, Fla. Before moving to Naples, he served on the staff of Marble Collegiate Church in New York City for seven years.

Prior to New York, he served as senior minister at the Shiloh United Church of Christ in Dayton, Ohio, and as the senior minister of the Mount Zion Congregational Church in Mount Sinai, N.Y.

Following his ordination in 1974, he was pastor at the Salem United

Church of Christ in Toledo, Ohio.

Dr. Patterson is a native of Akron, Ohio. He graduated from Heidelberg College in Tiffin and received his Master of Divinity degree cum laude from Andover Newton Theological Seminary in 1974.

He was awarded his doctorate from Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis in 1980, and a Master of Business Administration from Dowling College in 1984.

He is active in denominational and ecumenical activities on the local, state and national levels, the Rotary Club, and various educational and human services organizations.

Appreciation Night Will be Jazzy Affair

The Bay View Association is pleased to announce a special engagement for Appreciation Night 2007.

It is our way to say thank you to our friends and neighbors in the Little Traverse Bay community for the continued support of our programs for more than 100 years.

At 8 p.m. Friday, July 20, John M. Hall Auditorium will be filled with the sounds of great jazz as Johnny Trudell (often referred to as "The Doc Severinson of Detroit") and his 18-piece big band will perform.

Joining Trudell, the famous "Sounds of Sinatra Show" will feature Mark Randisi singing Frank's original songs.

Trudell is one of the original artists who founded the "Motown Sound" along with the Funk Brothers. He has played or recorded for just about every Motown star as well as Doc Severinson, Johnny Carson, The Tommy Dorsey Band, Count Basie, Nancy Wilson, Rosemary Clooney, Aretha Franklin, The Four Tops, Frankie Valli, The Temptations, The Four Freshman, Paul Anka, Frank Sinatra Jr. and Tony Bennett – to name only a few.

The band regularly performs at many southeast Michigan and international jazz festivals. It is the yearly host and headliner for sellout crowds attending The Michigan Jazz Festival at Schoolcraft College. Trudell is

presently the principle contractor for The Fisher Theater, The Fox Theater, and Andiamo's Show Room.

Listed in the personnel of Trudell's band is an impressively talented group of Detroit area all-stars including some who have played under his direction for over 30 years. Others were recruited from stellar jazz groups like The Austin-Moro Big Band and The Brookside Jazz Ensemble. The one thing they all share is a love for this brand of jazz (Kenton, Basie, Woody, Buddy Rich, Ray Charles and others) under the baton of one of the finest musicians anywhere. The collective musical result is eclectic and electric – music designed to knock you off your feet!

Exploration of the Psalms
