Hearing May 19 on Terrace Inn Liquor License

Mo Rave, leaseholder and innkeeper at the Terrace Inn, has requested that the Bay View Board of Trustees amend his lease to allow the sale of liquor at the Inn.

The board will hold a mid-morning hearing on the request during its Saturday, May 19, meeting at Wade Administration Building.

The board established a precedent in 2004 when it approved granting a liquor license to Stafford's Bay View

Inn. Trustees also adopted guidelines for operating a business with a liquor license in Bay View.

Those guidelines include: no alcohol except beer and wine could be served to the public during the season (June 1 – Sept. 30); service limited from 12 p.m. to 10 p.m. during the season; no Sunday service during the season; no visible bar at anytime, though a temporary bar is allowed for private parties and receptions; no

sale of alcohol to guest rooms.

The board gave its blessing to the Bay View Inn liquor license subject to an annual review for compliance with the guidelines.

Neighbors within 300 feet of the Terrace Inn were mailed notices regarding the request for a liquor license. They were given the opportunity to comment in writing or to comment at the May 19 public hearing.

Hartnett is a member of Kiwanis and his interests include skiing, bicycling, golf and tennis. He lives in Harbor Springs with his wife, Denise.

Stevens grew up in Petoskey and baby sat children of Bay View members. She graduated from Petoskey High School, received an Associate of Arts degree from North Central Michigan College, and a bachelor's degree in journalism from Michigan State University.

Before coming to Bay View, Stevens was manager of marketing and public relations at Cheboygan Memorial Hospital. Prior to working in Cheboygan, she was the director of marketing and public relations at Charlevoix Area Hospital. Before her work in health care, Stevens was a reporter and photographer for the Petoskey News-Review, and also has been a freelancer.

Stevens is a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Petoskey, and the Board of Trustees of Camp Daggett, where she was a camper growing up. She enjoys sailing, skiing, camping and photography. She lives in Petoskey.
